About Mitra Jyothi

Mitra Jyothi is a trust registered under Indian Trust Act in the year 1990. Our main focus is on education, livelihood training and economic empowerment of persons with visual impairment and other disabilities. At Mitra Jyothi, we believe in providing education and vocational training that is accessible by all, including persons with disabilities. Given the right opportunities and education, they have the potential to become independent and self-sufficient and can compete with the non-disabled world. Thus, our various programs are designed with a view to bring them into mainstream of the society, thereby aiding the creation of an inclusive society. This Shri Kusum Kumar Khaitan School & Rehabilitation Centre which is being run under the able guidance of Ms. Madhu Singhal who has covered many milestones not only in India but also outside countries. Our main area of work is to provide support to the visually impaired for their education, and our Placement Cell assists people with all disabilities, making them economically independent.

OUR VARIOUS ON-GOING ACTIVITIES ARE:

A. DIGITAL TALKING BOOK LIBRARY:

The talking book library was started in 1992 to cater to the general reading and educational needs of visually impaired students in schools and colleges. The library converts print books into Audio Cassettes and CD's. Audio master cassettes and CDs are recorded at the recording rooms mostly with the help of volunteers. Home recording is also being done by our volunteers. We record books in fiction, non-fiction and textbooks in various languages. Members can borrow audio cassettes and CDs made at the library. The talking book library has helped the visually impaired of all age groups and socio-economic backgrounds across the state and the country. We are members of the Daisy Forum of India and our catalogue is being shared in the combined catalogue of DFI. This way we are able to reach out to the people from any part of the country.

Monthly Kannada magazine - **Sanchaya** is continuing its publication. This covers several topics related to health issues, general knowledge, information technology, competitive exams, jokes, news etc. which is quite useful for visually impaired. During the year, we continued giving the magazine in the form of CD as per the individual member's request.

This year **Axis Bank Foundation** partnered with us for the Digital Talking Book Library project. We have also started distribution of **India Today Weekly Magazine** in audio DAISY (CD) format. Another important milestone was covered in which we have increased our outreach in rural areas by collaborating with **Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan** to distribute our CD's in government schools in different districts and talukas of Karnataka.

Library membership for the visually impaired has reached 1432 members. The details given below are for the financial year 2010-2011.

B. BRAILLE TRANSCRIPTION CENTRE:

The Braille Transcription centre was started in 1999 and converts books required by the visually impaired into Braille. Books are printed at the centre on request basis throughout the year. Majority of the books printed in Braille at Mitra Jyothi are the textbooks for students. All visually impaired/low vision people can take advantage of the centre. These books are of great help to students especially at the primary level where remembering spellings is a problem and it improves their vocabulary. The Braille books help students to establish a sound foundation in their academics. We convert textbooks, storybooks, magazines etc in e-text and Braille.

We do undertake need-based requests from individuals and some of the organizations. In this area, we had received various individuals requests besides some of the states like kerala had also given us some work related to Braille Transcription. These requests are mainly related to various reports and documents.

Total no. of pages of Text Scanned, Edited and Brailled: 10,932 pages

Total Beneficiaries: 35 beneficiaries including students, professionals and institutions.

2 students deserve a special mention here. Mallapa N Bandi and P V Nagraj have reached the pinnacle of success having received multiple gold medals for securing highest marks in Graduation.

C. COMPUTER TRAINING CENTRE:

Mitra Jyothi's Computer Training Centre has been providing computer training to the visually impaired and low vision students since 2005. We conduct basic and advance computer classes, summer workshops (i.e. MS Excel, MS Word and Internet) throughout the year. Following were the courses conducted during the year.

- Short Term Basic Computer Course during summer (2 months duration): April to June 2010
Students: 15
- Career Centric Computer Training - Basic (9 months duration): July 2010 to April 2011
Students: 15
- Advance Computer Course training in collaboration with Tech Mahindra (6 months duration): Jan 2010 to June 2010
Students: 15
- Software Testing Foundation / Accessibility Testing Course in collaboration with Prakat Solutions (1 month duration): February 2011 to March 2011
Students: 3
- Need Based Training was conducted for 2 students, in which the students were trained in different aspects of computers and mobility according to their requirements.
- Guest Speakers and successful professionals with Visual Impairment (Role Models) were invited from time to time to motivate our visually impaired trainees.

D. INDEPENDENT LIVING SKILLS:

This is a training program for visually impaired women in the age group of 18 to 35 years. Visually impaired women are taught life skills like mobility, home management, cooking, crafts making, stitching and hygiene free of cost. It is a residential training program aimed at making the trainees self reliant and independent. 22 girls have been benefited from this course during the year. Managing Trustee along with project coordinator had visited Chamrajnagar District in Karnataka State, which is 400 kms from Bangalore. During this exercise, 27 villages were physically visited in collaboration with Mobility India with a view to motivate the parents and guardians of visually impaired girls to send them to our institution for attending the Independent Living Skills training.

E. JOB PLACEMENT CELL:

The placement cell was started in 1999 and is open to both the visually impaired, and people with other disabilities as well. We have placed more than 600 candidates with disabilities so far. The job placement cell helps find job opportunities according to their skills in various sectors. It is open for both qualified and non-qualified disabled people having no age bar. We had appointed new staff for placement cell. During the year, we were able to place 20 candidates.

F. LOW VISION AIDS/ APPLICANCES –

Low vision aids and appliances received from UK are being utilized by our students. Here there are different types of equipments, which help low vision people to read books in large print format. The equipments were donated by one of our well wishers from UK. 10 students have benefited by this facility this year.

G. Short Term Course**1. Workshop on Consumer Rights –**

A one day Workshop on Consumer Rights was organized for 50 students and library members sponsored by NIVH during December 2010. This workshop was conducted by eminent experts in this field such as Mr. Shiv Kumar, Senior Advocate, Mrs. Shakunthala Narsimhan, Consumer Rights Activist, and Ms. Maitreyi, Advocate.

2. House Keeping and Social Skills –

Mitra Jyothi conducted a six day short-term course in “House Keeping and Social Skills” during March 2011 in collaboration with National Institute for Visually Handicapped, Dehradun where 45 participants took part.

SOCIAL WORK STUDY INTERNSHIPS –

Mitra Jyothi gave opportunities of social study internships to the interested persons, namely:

- 10 Students from Christ University, Bangalore completed 25 hrs of work-study.
- 5 Students from Xavier’s Institute of Management and Entrepreneurship, Bangalore completed 3 week field study.
- 1 student from IIM- Indore completed 1 week of internship.
- 6 students from National Institute of Fashion Technology, Bangalore completed one month of field study.
- 2 students from Jyothi Nivas College, Bangalore completed 3 weeks of internship.
- 1 student from Jyothi Seva School for Blind Children completed 2 weeks of internship.
- 20 visually impaired students from National Institute of Visually Handicapped, Dehradun came for 4 days field trip organized by Mitra Jyothi, which included visits to various NGOs and IT companies.
- 1 student from Sarvodaya College of Nursing, Bangalore completed 2 days of research study.

AWARDS –

1. Mitra Jyothi received the State Award from Chief Minister Sri. Yeddyurappa, for its special service for persons with disabilities on World Disability Day 3rd December 2010.
2. Ms. Madhu Singhal was awarded the IBN7 Bajaj Allianz Super Idols Award in recognition of the extraordinary work in the field of education for persons with visual impairment. She was felicitated by Mr. Salman Khan in Mumbai in November 2010.

3. Ms. Madhu Singhal was also one amongst few “Saduru Gnanananda Awardees 2011” in the category Woman Social Entrepreneur, empowering the visually impaired. She was felicitated on 12th March 2011 in Chennai by the Chief Guest Sri R. V. Shekar, Managing Director, Lanchor Holdings Ltd. and awarded by the Guest of Honour Swami Nityanandagri of Thapovanam.

EVENTS –

1. **April 2010** – Volunteers from M/S Target visited Mitra Jyothi and spent a day in Library work and also played games with our trainees.
2. **10th June 2010** – Spiritual leader Swami Sukhbodhananda visited Mitra Jyothi and addressed our trainees, volunteers and other invitees. His lecture was truly inspiring and educative. Swamiji also distributed Certificates to Mitra Jyothi’s students who had completed 2 months short-term computer course.
3. **20th June 2010** – A spiritual lecture by Shri M, Mumtaz Ali (Swamiji) sponsored by Satsang Foundation was held in Mitra Jyothi premises. He is an authority on Bhagwat Geeta.
4. **24th July 2010** – Mitra Jyothi organized a Musical Concert “Ek Se Badkar Ek” as a fund-raising effort at Dr. Ambedkar Hall, Bangalore where renowned singers like Babloo Mukherjee performed retro hindi songs for a large number of audience, including our volunteers & well wishers.
5. **24th July 2010** – Alcatel Lucent Technologies invited students of Mitra Jyothi to their campus, had Lunch with the students and organized games and quizzes. They also contributed a sum of Rs. 2,27,800/- to Mitra Jyothi collected from their employees.
6. **August 2010** – A Dental check up camp was organized this year also by Marwari Youth Federation in collaboration with Dr. Khincha. 70 persons from 3 organizations i.e., NFB, Enable India and Mitra Jyothi were benefitted.
7. **September 2010** – Corporation Bank presented us with a Public Address System for the use in Mitra Jyothi’s auditorium. Our old library members, Mr. Chandrashekhar and Mr. V S Gupta were instrumental in its arrangement.
8. **9th October 2010** – A musical event was organized in Mitra Jyothi’s auditorium where Roshan Rajan and Ritvik Rajan (visually impaired brothers) entertained people with songs in Hindi, Kannada and many other languages. A big gathering enjoyed the musical evening.
9. **October 2010** – Different groups of volunteers from CISCO came to Mitra Jyothi for a day of service where they helped in our day to day activities in the Library, gardening work and spent time mentoring and playing games with our trainees.
10. **4th January 2011** – Mitra Jyothi and National Federation of the Blind, Karnataka Branch together celebrated World Braille Day, the 202nd Birth Anniversary of Louis Braille at the Mitra Jyothi Auditorium. On this occasion Mr. K.V. Rajanna, State Commissioner for persons with disabilities came as the Chief Guest. Scholarships (under the National Scholarship scheme) and CD players (under the ADIP scheme of the Govt. of India) were distributed to about 100 needy students with visual impairment.
11. **18th February 2011** – A workshop on “Sources of Power” was jointly organized by Mitra Jyothi and Common Purpose which was attended by leaders from Govt, NGO and corporate sectors.

12. **26th March 2011** – Mitra Jyothi celebrated its 21th Anniversary on 26th of March 2011 in its own premises where CD players were distributed to needy students. Some of the volunteers were also honoured on this occasion. Later on, our students presented cultural programmes followed by the distribution of certificates to the trainees of Career Centric Computer Training (CCCT) and Software Testing Foundation Course.
